## [FORMULATION]

**Form & Buffer:** Supplied as solution form in 0.01M PBS, pH7.4, containing 0.05% Proclin-300, 50% glycerol.

# [ QUALITY CONTROL ]

**Content:** The quality control contains recombinant AGER disposed in loading buffer.

**Usage:** 10uL per well when 3,3'-Diaminobenzidine(DAB) as the substrate. 5uL per well when used in enhanced chemilumescent (ECL).

**Note:** The quality control is specifically manufactured as the positive control.

Not used for other purposes.

**Loading Buffer:** 100mM Tris(pH6.8), 1% SDS, 150mM NaCl, 50% glycerol, 0.02% BPB, 50mM DTT and 0.02% NaN<sub>3</sub>.



# [STORAGE AND STABILITY]

Storage: Avoid repeated freeze/thaw cycles.

Store at 4°C for frequent use.

Aliquot and store at -20°C for 12 months.

**Stability Test:** The thermal stability is described by the loss rate. The loss rate was determined by accelerated thermal degradation test, that is, incubate the protein at 37°C for 48h, and no obvious degradation and precipitation were observed. The loss rate is less than 5% within the expiration date under appropriate storage condition.





Figure 1. Western Blot Sample: Recombinant AGER, Rat
